- ✓ Midwestern Career College (MCC) has determined that the curriculum of Dialysis Technologist Training Program meets the state educational requirements for licensure or certification for Certified Hemodialysis Technologist/Technician (CHT) in Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin. The CHT certification should be obtained within 18 months from being employed as a dialysis technician.
- ✓ MCC was unable to determine if completion of Dialysis Technologist Training Program meets the state educational requirements for licensure or certification for Certified Hemodialysis Technologist/Technician (CHT) in other 47 states and the U.S. territories.

In addition, Passing the Phlebotomy course offered within the program provides eligibility to sit for the Registered Phlebotomy Technician (RPT) exam through American Medical Technologists (AMT) or Phlebotomy Certification through National Center for Competency Testing (NCCT). RPT Exam requires completion of min. 50 venipunctures draws and 10 skin punctures.

Although there is no licensing requirement for phlebotomy technicians, employers prefer to hire experienced workers or certified applicants who have passed a national examination, indicating that the candidates meet certain standards of competence.
